- The human form of God's **GLORY**.
(42:6 Covenant)

c. The one empowered by the **SPIRIT**

- In one verse we see the **TRINITY**.
(42:8)

d. The one who will bring **JUSTICE** to the **NATIONS**.

- The primary **WITNESS** to God's Character
(41:24, 29; 52:13)
